From Principal Ken Koll

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Thomas the Apostle,

An elderly gentleman was driving down the freeway when his cell phone rang. Answering, he heard his wife's voice urgently warning him, "Herman, I just heard on the news that there's a car going the wrong way on I-90/94. Please be careful!" "It's not just one car," Herman said, "It's hundreds of them!"

Leading our Parish School is a daunting responsibility. Fr. Trail and I constantly ask ourselves what it means to be a Catholic School in the 21st Century – in Hyde Park. At times, it seems as though education reform efforts are going full speed ahead in the wrong direction – with conviction. Some attempts at school reform cause me to throw my hands up in frustration. Nevertheless, I find hope in the constant flow of research aimed at building a deeper understanding of the learning process.

Five years ago, I read that 800 million jobs would be replaced by technology by 2030. Nearly 1 year ago, ChatGPT exploded on the scene and changed written communication in ways that we are still trying to grasp. Three weeks ago, I saw a report that by 2050, 3D printers will be in place on the moon to use moon dust to construct landing/launch pads and structures to expand space travel. The report also indicated that NASA is currently exploring ways to substantially reduce the amount of time it takes to travel to Mars.

No doubt, our current elementary school students will enter adult life in a world that will be radically different than what we now experience. Since the advent of ChatGPT, I've heard many educators ask if that means we don't need to teach writing conventions any longer. I believe that is the wrong type of question to explore. I believe that we should ask how we can compel students to express their voices, to communicate, create, imagine, and problem solve in ways that move well past the writing process that we currently use. As a Catholic School, we must also question how we can cultivate people of faith, future leaders with a moral compass.

This calls for bold exploration on the part of our school. At St. Thomas, we have embarked on a journey to expand our learning environment to touch a world that we can only just imagine. We must be as adaptive as we are secure, as full of questions as we are full of certainty. We need one foot grounded in our current reality and the other foot jumping to the middle of the Century guided by a mind that is full of knowledge and wonder.

And...most especially...we must see our ever changing world through the eyes of faith. That probably means that we will often find ourselves like our friend Herman, going in the opposite direction of society. Please pray for our school and our students, we pray for you all the time.






